- In recent decades, modern-day paranormal investigators and
 'ghost-hunters' have emerged along with an heightened interest in
 the paranormal; and many television shows have sprung up to
 satisfy the demand for better explanations of such phenomena.
- Such investigative work into the paranormal, however, dates back millennia; and that, across many different cultures.
- In the **Bible**, for instance, we have an interesting passage in which **Saul** the first king of the Kingdom of Israel and Judah asks to **consult with a medium**. The passage [/Samuel 28:/] reads:
 - "Then Saul said to his servants, "Seek out for me a woman who is a medium, that I may go to her and inquire of her." And his servants said to him, "Behold, there is a medium at En-dor."

- In his meeting with the medium, he asks to speak with the departed prophet Samuel.
- She channels Samuel before Saul and the king is able to consult with him.
- Mediums and spiritualists had previously been outcast from his kingdom.
- But this account from the Bible clearly confirms the presence, recognition, and recruitment of mediums in ancient times.
- While a medium is not necessarily an investigator, the objective is the same; namely, to find answers from beyond.



As previously mentioned, the **UK** is one of the regions of the world with a notable history of hauntings; thus it is no surprise that some of the earliest organizations to study and document paranormal happenings started there.

- The Royal Society (established in 1660 in London) was one of the earliest organizations to study psychic functions in a scientific manner.
- Also in the U.K., The Ghost Club was founded in 1862 as the oldest organization in the world associated with psychical research with their prime interest being that of paranormal phenomena associated with ghosts and hauntings.
 - To this day, this non-profit outfit still conducts investigations and research in the field, sharing findings with their members.

On the heels of the Age of Enlightenment in the 17–18th centuries another organization that began to study and investigate claims of psychic and paranormal phenomena was the Society for Psychical Research which began its activities around 1882 in the U.K.



- They created a methodological and administrative framework to carry out scientific research into paranormal events such as apparitions, clairvoyant visions, precognitive dreams, to name a few.
- They have published numerous findings in The Journal of the Society for Psychical Research (JSPR) since 1884 and also in The Magazine of the Society for Psychical Research (previously, Paranormal Review) available to their members.

- The Psi Encyclopedia (https://psi-encyclopedia.spr.ac.uk/) also offers a hefty (and free) collection of articles and biographies accessible to all.
- Many talks and lectures still take place to this day.
- Two of the most famous cases investigated by the Society for Psychical Research, better know as The SPR, include:

- These were some of the most documented and studied cases of the paranormal in history.
- Though not without their fair share of controversy and skepticism, the cases provide rather compelling evidence.





Pioneers in the field:

• While there have been numerous renowned investigators in the field, the following stand out as pioneers who have gained notable repute and have laid solid foundations for future generations wishing to pursue investigations into the paranormal.

l. Harry Price (UK)

- Paranormal investigator
- Early member (1920) of the Society for Psychic Research (SPR).
- He attended thousands of séances and worked on hundreds of haunting cases, including the famous Borley Rectory – one for which he spent an entire year on-site meticulously researching and documenting events.

1. Harry Price (UK)

From the mid-nineteenth century to the early 20th century, Spiritualism – a belief that spirits of the dead communicate with the living through a medium – proliferated amongst the middle– and upper–classes of society in Britain and the United States.



- With this came countless fraudsters claiming to be genuine mediums.
- Apart from investigating haunting cases, Price was particularly adept in exposing such fraudster mediums.
- He did so with the use of many scientific instruments (electroscopes, barographs, thermographs, etc.) Having also set up The National Laboratory of Psychical Research and The Séance Room, Price was able test the genuineness and claims of mediums and psychics many turning out to be fakes while some others genuine.


Harry Price's **ghost-hunting** kit, which amongst other things contained both reflex & cinematograph cameras, tools for sealing doors & windows, apparatus for secret electrical controls, steel tape, drawing instruments, torch, bottle of mercury and powdered graphite for developing finger-prints.



Pioneers in the field:

- 2. Ed & Lorraine Warren (USA)
- Ed Warren Demonologist, author & Paranormal investigator
- Lorraine Warren Clairvoyant / Psychic medium
 - & Paranormal investigator
- They founded the New England Society for Psychic Research (NESPR) in 1952.
- They have investigated thousands of cases over their careers, never charging clients for their services.

2. Ed & Lorraine Warren (USA)

- Ed Warren was a self-taught demonologist (one who studies demons and evil spirits).
 He read everything he could on the demonic which helped him to deal with such entities in his case work.
- He grew up in a house in Bridgeport, Connecticut which he claimed to be haunted.
- Ed wrote many **books** on the subject and also (along with Lorraine) **lectured** on the subject of the paranormal across the US and also abroad.
- He and Lorraine regularly collaborated with members of the Church on numerous cases – many of which entailed exorcisms.



2. Ed & Lorraine Warren (USA)

- Lorraine Warren started out as a skeptic even though she was gifted from an early age with a clair voyance ability and sensibility to see and interact with spirits.
- She met Ed Warren at 16 and they married just a few years later.
- Lorraine partnered with Ed to investigate paranormal cases across the US and also abroad.
- She was able to use her special abilities to help identify and communicate with specific spirits or entities to help solve cases of hauntings and other paranormal phenomenon.
- He career in the field spanned no less than 65 years.

Notable Cases of Ed & Lorraine Warren

- Though the pair investigators worked thousands of cases over their lengthy career, here are some of the most notable ones – all of which, by the way, have been made into movies.
 - 1970: Anabelle doll
 - 1971: The Perron Family Haunting
 - 1975: The Amityville & Lutz family tragedy
 - 1981: Demon Murder Trial



2. Ed & Lorraine Warren (USA)

The Warren Occult Museum

- In their illustrious careers in investigating thousands of cases of the paranormal around the world, Ed & Lorrain have collected an incomparable collection of artifacts related to hauntings, the demonic, and the occult.
- The objects were collected and held in the Warren's home as early as 1952.
- It's most famous artifact is the **Annabelle doll**.
- Though it has been a popular attraction over the years, the museum, however, appears to be closed since 2019.
